Archdiocese of Santa Fe coronavirus (COVID-19) & Flu Precautions

- Please stay home if you are sick or are experiencing symptoms. If you

- Communicants MUST receive Holy Communion in the hand. Please do not ask to receive on the tongue. The Archbishop grants dispensation to those who attend the Extraordinary form to receive in the hand during these restrictions.
- Observe social distancing when entering and leaving Church.



THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

For some reason, it is easier to genuflect in reverence to the presence of Christ in the tabernacle of a church, than to genuflect in reverence to the same presence of Christ in another person's soul. We wrongly believe that God divides himself, placing himself in one place in preference to another. It doesn't work that way. Love of God and love of neighbor are intimately and inseparably connected because the essence and spark of God's very presence is in all creation. God's presence is just as real in the one who is good, as in the one who is bad, and the one who is just, and the one who is unjust.

Our brains get in the way of truly contemplating the awesomeness of this truth. We like to separate things into boxes, the sheep from the goats and the deserving from the undeserving. But, with God there are no distinctions such as this. Our human classifications, subdivisions, and definitions hold no power or have any weight on God's eyes. Sadly, we relate to God and to each other as if they do.

We cannot be deaf to the world's pain. It is not about having, hording, accumulating, acquiring, securing, storing protecting, owning, claiming, or any of the other human terms we use to distinguish mine from yours. We put so much power in these words and that power, even though we may not always realize it, can cause those words and the distinctions they carry to wound and hurt others. We have the whole order of things wrong, but we are so set on preserving this order that we are absolutely afraid to do it any other way. We go through hoops trying to convince ourselves why the perils of the person seeking a new place to call home are not our perils that we turn our back and justify closing our doors. It makes perfect sense to us. Yet, it makes no sense in terms of our faith. It doesn't square with any of the words found in Sacred Scripture or in any time-tested teaching of the church.

We have it all reversed. We know that we do because when Jesus speaks about such things and the words of the Old Testament prophets ring out again, we start to feel uncomfortable and anxious. What we do, directly or by omission, to one of the least of these little ones we do to God. It is quite possible that some of what we are doing personally, economically, politically, globally, and even religiously is doing more harm than good. Let's ponder that a bit.

- No congregational singing. Only singing by one person and one or two instrumentalists.
- Please follow safe practices—wear a mask, wash hands often and stay 6 feet apart.
- Presbyterian Hospital downtown now has 34 Covid patients. Visits are now restricted to only one family member per day for non-covid patients. For non-covids on palliative care or hospice, two family members are allowed. A priest could be one of those but once the priest is finished, no other family members will be allowed in. No visitation for covid positive patients.
- Again, homilists should not endorse/attack candidates or parties. Draw people to make good conclusions via persuasive teaching or principals. Endorsing or excoriating politicians or parties by name alienates, especially if persons have generational loyalty to a certain party.

IMPORTANT—We are quickly approaching the end of the renovation of the interior of the church. The pews have been refinished, the top half of the walls have been plastered and painted. The flooring material is here and will be installed once the bottom half of the wall is plastered and painted. The choir lofts still need to be completed. BUT, we are getting there.

With COVID-19, our contributions have been low both for the general fund and the building fund. When we presented our plan to the Archdiocese, we had planned on the contributions to the building fund to be around \$3,000 per month. This would have brought us to a figure enough to pay for the entire renovation. Also, because there were obstacles that came about, there were additional issues that needed to be taken care of and that added to the amount of the initial project.

Due to the pandemic, we have not had the funds that we had anticipated. We are not far from having the entire amount to pay for the renovation. We do not want to borrow the extra funds to complete the payment for this project. We are asking for your help once again. We realize that you are facing the same difficulties as the church. If you are able, please help by contributing to the Building Fund. Thank you for what you have already done for Immaculate Conception. We appreciate your generosity and faithfulness to our Parish. ARCHDIOCESE WORKSHOP—ABUSE AWARENESS
